Shopping Time! Most of the show cattle in Wyoming are bought around this time! (450-700 lbs.)

OCTOBER - JANUARY

Feed, Feed, Feed. Also a crucial time to halter break! Be starting hair care!

JANUARY -FEBRUARY

Tagging Time in January! February 1st Ownership Deadline, Keep feeding!

MARCH -

If you haven't started hair care and daily work with show sticks, you may be behind your competition! Daily routines are your friend!

JUNE - JULY

Enter your projects in June! Keep them cool!
Practice both showing and standing your cattle.
They will need to stand for awhile on show day!

JULY -AUGUST Clip your cattle for fair! Think about what you will need for your animals during fair week!

TIMELINE 4-H SHEEP AND GOATS

MARCH -MAY Shopping Time! Most of the show lambs and goats in Wyoming are bought around this time! Typically buying December - February born animals

MARCH -JUNE Feed, Feed. Also a crucial time to halter break and start practicing showing! Start your shag daily care! Don't forget to shear the first time before it gets hot!

MARCH -JUNE Depending your lamb and what they weigh, you also need to develop a daily exercise program for your sheep! They need to have fat on them before you start working them!

MAY -JUNE

Time to tag in your lambs and goats! This month marks ownership deadline on June 1st!

JUNE -JULY Enter your projects in June! Keep them cool!

Need to start picturing ideal weight for show day and where they may end up! Crucial time for getting legs and showing right!

JULY -AUGUST Clip your projects for fair! Start playing "fair" before you go. Time to think about drenches and traveling? Muzzles? What are your fair needs?

TIMELINE 4-H SWINE

MARCH -MAY Shopping Time! Most of the show pigs in Wyoming are bought around this time! Typically pigs are 5 - 8 months of age at time of showing here in Wyoming.

MARCH -JUNE Feed, Feed. Also a crucial time to whip break and start practicing showing! Start your shag daily care! Don't forget to get a cool spot set up before it gets hot!

MARCH -JUNE

Depending your pig and what they weigh, you also need to develop a daily exercise program for your swine!

MAY -JUNE

Time to tag in your swine! This month marks ownership deadline on June 1st!

JUNE -JULY Enter your projects in June! Keep them cool! Need to start picturing ideal weight for show day and where they may end up! Crucial time for getting hair, hide, and showing right!

JULY -AUGUST Clip your projects for fair! Start playing "fair" before you go. Time to think about penning, traveling, etc. What are your fair needs?

JULY -AUGUST
